



Announcement from Bangbo Police Station

Subject of Anti-Bribery Policy

Fiscal Year B.E. 2569 (2026)

According to the Organic Act on Anti-Corruption B.E. 2561, Section 128, paragraph one, it prohibits any government official from receiving property or any other benefit that can be calculated as income from anyone, in addition to properties or benefits that should be obtained according to laws, rules or regulations issued by virtue of the provisions of the law. Except for receiving property or any other benefits in an ethical manners according to the criteria and amounts specified by the NACC and the Code of Ethics for Police Officials 2021, Section 2(2), from honesty, performing duties in accordance with the law or regulations of the Royal Thai Police with transparency, not exhibiting behavior that is suggestive of wrongful exploitation, being responsible for human rights duties, being ready to receive inspections and take responsibility, having good consciences and being considerate of society. Also, Section 2(4), government officials must think of the public interests more than personal interests, have public spirit, cooperate, and sacrifice in doing good for the public and creating happiness for society. In addition, there is a plan to reform the country in terms of preventing and suppressing corruption and misconduct. (Revised Edition) to determine important reform activities. Activity 4: Develop the Thai bureaucracy to be transparent with no benefits. Goal 1, Section 1.1, Every government agency must announce that all government officials do not accept gifts and presents of any kind in the performance of their duties (No Gift Policy).

Therefore, in order to prevent conflicts between personal and public interests (Conflict of Interest), accepting bribes, gifts, gifts, or any other benefits that affect the performance of duties at Bangbo Police Station, guidelines for practice and policy announcements have been established on the subject of the Anti-Bribery Policy, the details of which are as follows;

Objectives

1. To prevent or reduce the opportunity to receive bribes or conflicts of interest in various forms to police officers under Bangbo Police Station.
2. To encourage police officers under Bangbo Police Station to have a conscience in refusing to accept gifts and presents of all kinds from their duties.
3. To create strong and sustainable Organization of Integrity of the bureaucracy.
4. To determine measures, guidelines, and mechanisms to prevent giving/receiving bribes or any other benefits.
5. To set guidelines for receiving entertainment or gifts from executives and police officers under Bangbo Police Station in accordance with relevant laws and regulations.
6. To support and enhance operations under the national strategy, master plan under the national strategy and the national reform plan for prevention and suppression of corruption and misconduct, including being part of the guidelines for Integrity and Transparency Assessment (ITA) in government agencies, and the scope of enforcement for all police officers under Bangbo Police Station.

Definitions

“Bribe” means property or other benefits given to a person to enable that person to do or refrain from doing anything in his/her position, whether legal or illegal, as the bribe payer desires. This includes receiving gifts, facilitation fees, goodwill gestures, accepting donations, and similar benefits when offered, given, or received which can be considered as bribes. Also, it includes giving or receiving afterward. (Receiving gifts in the performance of duties is different from receiving according to ethics, which means receiving property or any other benefit that can be calculated as money from a person who gives it on an occasion, festival, or important day. Therefore, accepting gift, present, or kickback in the performance of duties may be considered bribes.)

“Gift, present, or any other benefit that affect the performance of duties” mean money, property, service, or any other benefit that have values and include tips, received by government officials in addition to salary, income, and benefit from government service in normal cases and affecting decisions, approvals, permissions, or anything else in the performance of duties in a manner that benefits in a dishonest way to the gift giver, both in the past or in the past while receiving, or in the future

“Property” means property and intangible objects that may have a price and may be held; such as money, house, car, stocks.

“Receiving property or any other benefits with ethics” means receiving property or any other benefits from relatives or from people who give them on various occasions normally according to customs, traditions or cultures or according to the etiquette practiced in society.

“Relatives” means parent, descendant, brother or sister from the same father or mother, uncle, aunt, spouse, parent or descendant of a spouse, adopted child or adoptee.

“Other benefit” means things of value; such as discount, entertainment, service, training or anything else of the same nature.

“Performing duties” means an act or performance of duties by a government official in a position who has been appointed or assigned to perform a particular duty, or to act on behalf of a certain duty, both in general and specifically as a police officer whose powers and duties have been specified by law or in accordance with the powers and duties specified by law to be the powers and duties of the police.

“Commander” means a person who has the authority to order, supervise, monitor, and inspect police officers under his jurisdiction.

“Subordinates” means all police officers under Bangbo Police Station, other than commanders, guidelines for preventing bribery.

1. All police officers under Bangbo Police Station are prohibited from being involved in giving or receiving any form of bribe, whether directly or indirectly.

2. All police officers under Bangbo Police Station are prohibited from requesting or accepting bribe for their own benefit or the benefit of others.

3. Follow the anti-corruption policy without getting involved in corruption, whether directly or indirectly.

4. Performance of duties must be carried out strictly in accordance with police regulations, police disciplines and related laws.

5. Refrain from performing anything that is considered giving or receiving a bribe.

6. Supervise the disbursement of expenses of affiliated agencies in accordance with relevant laws and regulations in strict manner.

7. Receiving donations or support, whether in the form of money, object, or property, for any activity or project must strictly comply with the rules, regulations, or announcements. Moreover, there must always be a receipt or proof of receipt of money to accompany the report.

8. Regarding of receiving property or any other benefits in an ethical manner, all police officers under Bangbo Police Station must strictly comply with the announcement of the National Anti-Corruption Commission, subject of the Criteria for Receiving Property or Any Other Benefits Through the Ethics of Officers, 2020.

Measures for Dealing with Policy Violations

1. Any violation and non-compliance with this policy may be subject to disciplinary action or criminal prosecution or other related laws. This includes direct supervisors who ignore wrongdoing or acknowledge that wrongdoing has occurred but do not take corrective action, which is subject to disciplinary punishment up to and including dismissal from government service.

2. Failure to be aware of this policy statement and/or related laws cannot be used as an excuse for non-compliance.

3. Supervisors in accordance with Police Department Order, No. 1212/2537, dated 1 October 1994, have the authority to supervise and take care of subordinates under their control to strictly adhere to and comply with this policy.

Measure of Monitoring

1. The Commander of Bangbo Police Station has announced his intention to manage the agency with honesty, transparency and in accordance with good governance principles by publicizing it to police officers in the area, affiliates and external stakeholders.

2. Supervisors in accordance with Police Department Order, No. 1212/2537, dated 1 October 1994, have the authority to supervise, monitor, and inspect subordinate police officers under their supervision in order to behave according to this announcement. In the case of any action that violates this announcement, a report to Superintendent of Mueang Bangbo Station must be submitted as soon as possible.

3. Bangbo Police Station has arranged to review and improve the operating guidelines as appropriate or according to changes in various significant factors.

4. The Administrative Department of Bangbo Police Station is the one who provided statistics on receiving bribes or receiving gifts or other benefits from performing duties. In addition, a list of problems and obstacles is reported to the Superintendent of Bangbo Police Station in every quarter.

Measures to Protect Complainants/Informers and Confidentiality

1. In considering complaints, the level of secrecy and protection of those involved will be determined in accordance with the Regulations on Maintaining Government Secrets, 2001, and in submitting the matter to the agency for consideration, the information provider and the complainant may suffered, for example, initial complaints against government officials are considered to be government secrets if they are anonymous letters. There must be consideration of specific cases that identify evidence in which the surrounding context is clearly evident, as well as having only certain witnesses identified. The name and address of the complainant must be concealed if it is to report influential persons, if the name and address of the complainant is not concealed, the relevant agencies must be informed and provide protection to the complainant as follows; "The commander shall use his discretion and order as appropriate to protect the complainant, witnesses, and persons providing information in the investigation. Those persons must be protected or safe from injustice that may result from making a complaint, testifying or providing that information." In the case where the name of the accused is specified, both the complainant and the respondent must be protected because the matter has not yet gone through the investigation process and may cause harassment and accusations to cause suffering and damage. In addition, for the complainant, The complainant's name must be concealed or disclosed in the complaint. The agency must not reveal the complainant's name to the responding agency because the complainant may suffer as a result of the complaint.

2. When making a complaint, the complainant and witnesses will not be subject to any action that affects their work or livelihood. If any action is necessary, such as separating the workplace to prevent the complainant, the witness, and the accused from meeting together, the consent of the complainant and the witness must be obtained.

3. Requests by victim, complainant, or witness, such as requests for a change of workplace or methods for preventing or resolving problems, should be considered by the person or agency in charge as seen appropriate.

4. The complainant must be protected from being persecuted.
